

Behaviour Policy

Introduction

At Musical Mayhem, we believe it is the right for all our students to attend classes in a safe, friendly and secure environment.

It is important that children from all backgrounds feel valued, respected, included, and engaged. We also believe that children should be free from humiliation and encouraged to learn from their mistakes. We believe that children should be polite and caring towards each other and their teachers, able to respect the resources and the play of others, able to engage in the rules and routines of the setting and to show the ability to listen and respond to adults.

The happiness and welfare of our students is paramount to us. We will not accept any form of bullying or bad behaviour.

Aims of this Policy

- To ensure students are supported, respected and valued.
 - To outline the expectations of students' behaviour.
 - To provide clear instructions on how behavioural issues should be dealt with.
 - To protect students from bullying and unsafe behaviour.

Student Expectations

Musical Mayhem is a place for children to have fun, be active and learn, and they should feel safe, accepted and included. For the sessions to be a harmonious environment, children must:

- Listen actively to their teachers and each other during classes.
- Treat everyone with respect, using kind words and actions.
- Stay focused and engaged, giving their best effort in games, songs, and creative tasks.
- Keep hands and feet to themselves, ensuring physical safety and comfort for all.
- Celebrate differences, embracing each child's unique voice, background, and abilities.
- Ask for help when needed and support others who may be struggling.

By following these guidelines, Musical Mayhem becomes a joyful space where creativity thrives and every child feels like they belong.

Procedure for Misbehaviour

1. If a member of staff has concerns regarding a child's behaviour, they will be given a warning and the staff member will explain why their behaviour has warranted the warning. The child will be told this is the first warning. A senior member of staff will be told that an official warning has been given.
2. If the behaviour is repeated, or any new issue arises, the child may have to sit out of the current activity or exercise and will be spoken to by a staff member to explain why they've been asked to sit out. This is their second warning and they will be told this is their second warning. A senior member of staff will be told that a second official warning has been given.
3. If the behaviour continues, the child will be removed from the remaining activities and given the third and final warning, the parent/carer will be contacted at this time. If the child is extremely disruptive or has performed an action that makes their presence in class unsafe (physically hurting another child or staff member, severe name calling etc.), the parent/carer will be contacted to collect the child immediately. A senior member of staff will be told that a third official warning has been given.

If this occurs on three separate occasions, the child may be asked to be removed from the Musical Mayhem class. Musical Mayhem will review removed children on a case by case basis when needed.

For Parents

At Musical Mayhem, we understand the differences between misbehaviour and behavioural difficulties and will always keep this in mind when dealing with all issues.
